Apply for Certification & Help Educate Your Neighbors!



MAY

You may qualify for Pollinator Friendly landscape certification if your yard provides food, water and shelter for bees, butterflies and other pollinators. If you have created a sustainable landscape that protects local waterways from pollutants and provides a safe habitat for local wildlife, you can earn Bay-Wise

certification.

Frederick County Master Gardeners welcome your application for one or both of these certi-

fications. All you need to do is complete the necessary forms and we will arrange a visit to your property to discuss your use of best gardening practices and answer any questions you may have. The process is relaxed, fun and free (although there is a charge if you would like a Pollinator Friendly sign).
