Small Acreage Cover Crop Program Sign-Up



The Small Acreage Cover Crop Program sign up will be in March to April. Watch the Garrett Soil Conservation District website for an exact date once it is released. You can find their website at <u>https://garrettscd.org</u> A farm must generate a minimum of \$1,000 annually to qualify. Payment reimburses the cost of seeds to a maximum of \$1,500 annually.

For those producers planting 10 acres or more of cover crops, look for your sign up to be in late June to early July.

Sign up for either program at the **Garrett Soil Conservation District**, **1916 Maryland Hwy, Mt Lake Park, Maryland**. The fields where you are planting cover crop must be located in Garrett County, Maryland.

Appalachia Farm and Food Alliance Annual Meeting



The Appalachia Farm and Food Alliance (AFFA) was established in 2023 as a non-profit organization that assists and promotes agriculture and the food system in western Maryland and the surrounding area. The mission is to facilitate collaboration between the agricultural and food system providers, to educate the public and provide solutions for food insecurity through the creation of a resilient, sustainable and equitable food and

agriculture system across the region. The organization is a federal 501c3 non profit and is registered in the state of Maryland as a charitable organization. This status allows the AFFA to apply for funding requiring non-profit status. In 2024, AFFA applied for funding from Rural Maryland Council and received a grant that will fund software development for Garrett Growers Cooperative, Inc. AFFA also provides financial business structure for the Western Maryland Food Council and the Mountain Maryland Hemp Alliance. The AFFA is governed by a 12 member board of directors. Twelve board members were elected in 2024 to serve one year to develop the bylaws of the organization.

On March 20th the AFFA will hold its annual meeting. At that meeting an official 12 member board of directors will be elected. The Board of Directors will serve staggered terms of one, two and three years. Deer Cooperator License Permit

Maryland farmers and landowners facing deer damage have several management strategies available. Common options include installing fencing to deter deer, using repellents (chemical or natural) to discourage feeding, and implementing controlled hunting to manage deer populations.

Obtaining a Deer Cooperator License is the last line of defense when fighting deer damage. For more information, visit <u>Maryland Department of Natural Resources</u> website for details on how to
