Day Camp: June 16 - 20th 2025

The 2025 Application for Day Camp will be sent out to all enrolled 4-H'ers in the near future. The cost will be \$100.00 due by May 9th. Space is limited so it is a first come basis. We may fill before the deadline, so don't delay.

4-H'ers will need to bring lunch and a drink each day. There will be a camp store where 4-H'ers may spend \$2.00 Mon-Thurs for an afternoon snack.

The deadline for registration is Friday, May 9th. Payment and all forms must accompany the application. There are no refunds.

The Overnight Camp forms will be emailed to all currently enrolled 4-H youth. The cost of the camp is \$400.00. We do offer a two-payment plan. The first payment is a commitment registration of \$200.00 due May 30th and the second payment is due June 27th.

No refunds and space is limited due to buses, so get your forms in before the deadline.

Please do not share the camp forms with friends that are not enrolled in 4-H. If we have space after the commitment deadline of May 30th, we will then open it up to those who are not currently enrolled.

There is a required first-time camper orientation for overnight camp that youth must attend. It will be on Wednesday, July 2nd at 6 p.m. at the 4-H Office.


Please note: A gift card purchase does not guarantee a spot at 4-H day or overnight camp. Timely registration is required.

Livestock Weigh-In

Swine: The 2025 swine weigh-in and ear tagging will be held on **Wednesday, May 21st** at the Charles County Fairgrounds from 5:00 p.m. – 7:30 p.m. If you are planning to raise swine for 4-H you must bring your pigs to the fairgrounds at that time. Sheep and Goat will be held on **Tuesday, May 20th from 5 p.m. – 7:30 p.m.** If you are planning on raising market lambs or goats for the 2025 fair you must bring your animals to the Charles County Fairgrounds on this day for them to be weighed in and tagged. - are showing a new animal species



Weather Science STEM Night

On March 28th, the 4-H office hosted a fun and educational Weather Science STEM Night, where youth participated in hands-on experiments set up in stations. Each station focused on different weather phenomena, offering a unique learning experience.

At the “Tornado in a Bottle” station, participants created their own mini tornadoes, while another station explored the differences between El Niño and La Niña. The air pressure station demonstrated how pressure affects weather patterns, and at the final station, youth made their own cloud spotters to help identify different types of clouds.

The event was a great success, giving participants the chance to learn about weather science in a fun and interactive way. We look forward to holding more STEM nights in the future exploring different topics!



Clover Nights

Clovers come together for crafts and exciting new lessons once a month. In January, they “dug for dinosaurs,” reading the illustrated picture book biography *Dinosaur Lady* about Mary Anning, the first female paleontologist. After learning about Anning’s groundbreaking work, they got hands-on by searching for dinosaur fossils in a sandbox.

Last month, Clovers were introduced to 4-H! They learned the 4-H pledge and created their own “Welcome to 4-H” door hangers, marking the start of their journey in the club. Each Clover Night is a fun way to learn and get creative, and we can't wait for the next one!



Algae Academy Exploration

Algae have the potential to be a solution to some of society’s biggest challenges. What can we use as renewable fuel? Algae. How will we feed a growing population? Algae. What’s that green stuff growing in the pool? Algae.

The Algae Academy takes algae from “Ick” to “Awesome!” and will have kids asking their own big questions as they explore the potential of algae in their environment. Youth will cultivate algae, monitor its growth, analyze and interpret data, and make connections as to how algae production has a positive impact on the global environment.

During Spring Break, youth ages 8 – 18 may register to participate in a two day exploration of algae. A teens only program will be offered, as well, to take a deeper dive into algae in our world.
