2025 National 4-H Conference

Applications are now being accepted for senior 4-H'ers to serve as Maryland 4-H Delegates to the 2025 National 4-H Conference, which will be held April 11 to 16, 2025, in Arlington, VA. Eligible 4-H members may submit their application through the 2025 National 4-H Conference Application Event Registration in 4-H Online.

Registration due date is November 15, 2024. 4-H'ers are strongly encouraged to submit their applications before the deadline.

To be considered to represent Maryland 4-H as a Delegate to the 2025 National 4-H Conference, a 4-H member must:

- Be between the ages of 14 and 18 as of January 1, 2025 (senior 4-H age).
- Be enrolled in the Maryland 4-H program.
- Submit a 4-H Portfolio for evaluation.
- Be nominated by their 4-H Educator (based on 4-H Portfolio).
- Participate in a Delegate interview.

Senior 4-H members may serve as Delegates for three leadership trips in their 4-H career. Senior 4-H'ers may attend each leadership trip only once and may attend no more than one leadership trip each 4-H (calendar) year.

Applicants must submit a 4-H Portfolio as part of their application in 4-H Online. The 4-H Portfolio consists of two items:

- 4-H Resume
- 4-H Essay

The 4-H Essay topic for this Delegate application is "Describe how one of your project areas has influenced your life outside of 4-H."

Applications must be submitted through 4-H Online by 11:59 pm on November 15, 2024.

Maryland 4-H State Council

The Maryland 4-H State Council is now accepting 2025 General Membership applications.

The Maryland 4-H State Council is the premier teen leadership opportunity in the Maryland 4-H program. It comprises active 4-H members from around the state interested in developing high-level leadership skills and representing their local 4-H program. State Council members can learn from each other, volunteers, and faculty/staff outside of their club and local 4-H Program.

A youth officer team and faculty/staff advisors lead the State Council. State Council members serve for the full 4-H (calendar) year. You can learn more about the 4-H State Council on the Maryland 4-H website.

Eligibility

4-H members who will be ages 13-18 as of January 1, 2025, may apply to serve on the Maryland 4-H State Council.

How to Apply

4-H members interested in serving on the 4-H State Council are strongly encouraged to contact their local 4-H office before applying.

Applications for the Maryland 4-H State Council are accepted through 4-H Online. Please encourage your teen leaders to log in to 4-H Online and apply.

4-H members who apply to serve on the 4-H State Council must submit a cover letter, 4-H resume, and photo. Youth will upload these items to your application in 4-H Online, in addition to answering a few questions.

All applications must be submitted in 4-H Online by 11:59 pm on November 15, 2024. 4-H Educators must review and approve the county application before forwarding it to the State 4-H Office for consideration.

National 4-H Leadership Opportunities

To be considered for a Leadership Trip, you must complete a portfolio package that includes an application, 4-H resume, and an essay. Portfolios are due to the State Office by January 15, 2025. However, for the following trips a Portfolio and Out-of-State Trip application review with the MoCo 4-H Educator is required no later than December 16, 2024.

- Camp Miniwanca (June)
- Virginia 4-H Congress (June)
- West Virginia Older Member's Conference (June)
- National 4-H Congress (November)

Here are some things to know about the program:

Senior Record Book

This record book includes elements from the Senior Portfolio, and replaces the Summary Record and 4-H Story.

Essay question

The 2025 Senior Essay Question is "Describe how one of your project areas has influenced your life outside of 4-H".

- Record Book and Portfolio submission
 - 4-H'ers can submit a regular Record Book or a Senior Record Book.
- Interview with representatives of the 4-H State Office

Portfolio 4-H'ers who qualify for leadership trips will be interviewed.

Record Book tips

4-H'ers should keep a binder with all their past Record Book materials, which can be helpful for creating resumes later.

Local 4-H Educator

4-H'ers can contact their local 4-H Educator for help with the process of applying for opportunities.

If you plan to do a Record Book for this year, please refer to the guidelines on 4-H Online.

What is a 4-H Record Book? A 4-H Record Book is a standard record of your activities in 4-H - your projects, activities, events, skills development and learning experiences. The 4-H Record Book helps improve your skills in record keeping, goal management, and reflection on your achievements and growth in 4-H.

If you are doing a Record Book, please:

- 1. Place a rubber band around the Record Book so the book stays together.
- 2. If you are submitting your Record Book personally, or if a Club Leader is submitting Record Books, please contact a 4-H Staff to be available to receive the Record Book(s.)


