## The Animal Husbandry and Quality Assurance (AHQA)

The Animal Husbandry and Quality Assurance (AHQA) system is now open for 2024! Members must be current on their AHQA to be eligible to exhibit animals at the 2024 MD 4-H Shows. The system can be accessed at: <https://ahqa.umd.edu/>. The link can also be found on the Animal Science Program Area page of the Maryland 4-H website.

The sheet contains specific requirements, tips for navigating the program, and any other relevant information. All 4-H members enrolled in alpacas, beef, dairy, goats, horse and pony, llamas, poultry, sheep, swine, and rabbits are required to have **completed the on-line training before July 15** to be eligible to exhibit their project animals in 2024 Montgomery County 4-H Shows.

The 2024 program must be completed using Firefox, Chrome, Edge, or Safari web browsers. Internet Explorer does not support this program. The narrated program contains two levels, a Junior-aged Level and an Intermediate/Senior-aged Level. The program automatically directs members to the correct level based on their birthdate. 4-Hers are required to complete the on-line training program when they reach each 4-H age division (juniors (8-10), intermediates (11-13), seniors (14-18) – all as of January 1 of the current year) OR when an Intermediate or Senior 4-H member chooses to show a new species since last completing the program within their age division - they must return to the program and complete it for the new species area (The Junior program does not have species-specific sections like the Intermediate/Senior program does). Passcodes issued to members between 2015-2023 should still be viable for returning members.

#### DIVISION 11: COMPUTER TECHNOLOGY

##### RULES

1. Exhibits should be accompanied by a one-paragraph description, which tells the purpose, limitations, unique features, hardware and software used.

##### SPECIAL NOTE REGARDING COMPUTER ENTRIES:

Exhibitors must bring a laptop preloaded with the application needed for their program to run. If the exhibitor does not have a laptop, they must bring detailed screenshots of the entry and the program's source code so the judge can evaluate the software entry. There is no internet connection in the 4-H Building. If the exhibitor is entering any internet or mobile applications, they must bring a laptop, the device, or detailed screen shots.

1. Original software written in a programming language (e.g. Python, Scratch, Blockly)
2. Hardware, robotics, and automation (e.g. Raspberry Pi controlling lights, robotics, Lego® Mindstorms®, etc.)
3. Professional development using MS Office software to write a resume, analyze data, or make a presentation (e.g. Word, Excel, PowerPoint)
4. Digital art and animation (e.g. GIMP, Procreate, Adobe Creative Suite)
5. Blog/Website design and development (e.g. designing/writing a blog in WordPress, or developing a website from scratch)
6. Digital music creation using MIDI controllers or electronic instruments (e.g. GarageBand, FL Studio)
7. 3D model printing and design (e.g. Tinkercad or Fusion 360)
8. Game development (e.g. Scratch, GameSalad, Unity)
9. Custom computer build (e.g. assembling a computer, understanding hardware like CPU, GPU, RAM)
10. Internet of things (IoT) (e.g. programming IoT devices for home automation or environmental monitoring)
11. Augmented/Virtual Reality interactive experience (e.g. CoSpaces EDU, Unity)

## Fair Tickets and New Parking Location

As a 4-H'er, if you are 12 or older and enter exhibits at the fair, you will get a free weekly pass!

As in the past, free and reduced-price entry tickets will be made available to 4-H members and their families. Purchasing can occur when you enter exhibits online or weekdays at the Fair Office between 9:00 a.m. and 4:00 p.m. after July 15 or between the hours of 9:00 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. on one of the Volunteer Workdays on Saturday, July 20, 27, or August 3. After these dates, tickets are only available at the advertised price.

The following free tickets for Fair admission will be provided to 4-H'ers who enter exhibits:

- 4-H indoor exhibitors and those with poultry, rabbits, pet show, and dog show will be provided with 1 season pass that includes free parking at Perry Pkwy.
- 4-H exhibitors with horses, beef, dairy, swine, goats, and sheep will be provided with 1 season pass including free parking at all entrances.
- 4-H exhibitors with beef, dairy, swine, goats, and sheep or hauling horses whose parents are not Life Members will be provided with an additional season pass including free parking at all entrances.

The following tickets are available for purchase by 4-H member families until 12:30 p.m. on the final Volunteer Saturday Workday.

- Season Pass that includes Free Parking at Perry Pkwy. only - \$50.00
- Season Pass – special pass for non-exhibitor sibling of a 4-H member (age 12-18) Perry Pkwy only - \$18.00
- 1 Day ticket – 4-H Family, Free Parking at Perry Pkwy. only - \$10.00
- 1 Day ticket – 4-H Family, entrance only, no parking - \$5.00

**New this year.** Free Parking and Shuttle buses will be from **Montgomery College Rockville Campus**, located at 900 Hungerford Drive Rockville, MD 20850. Free Shuttle Buses will be available from August 10 -17 starting at 10:00 a.m. every day.

- The last bus leaves for the Fairgrounds at 10:00 p.m. on weekends.

## Maryland State Fair

The Maryland State Fair, spans three weekends in 2024! Entries are now being accepted for the 2024 Maryland State Fair, which will be held from August 20 to September 8.

There are many different opportunities for 4-Hers to exhibit their 4-H project work in animal and non-animal divisions or to participate in a variety of other competitions at the 2024 State Fair. 4-H members will use one (or both) of two different entry systems, depending on the type of exhibit or contest. Here is a guide to which entry system to use!

Members will use the Maryland State Fair Blue Ribbon Entry System to enter the Division shows and exhibits listed below. Blue Ribbon Entry System entries will be accepted through July 15th at <https://marylandstatefair.com/4hffa/>. Entries must be verified by the county/city 4-H Extension Office/FFA.

- Divisions A-J (All animal exhibits except Dogs)
- Divisions L-S (All indoor exhibits except Club Booths and Banners)
- Some Division T exhibits (4-H Promotional Posters and 4-H Promotional Graphic Art Design)
- Some Division X events (Costume Animal Parade and 4-H/FFA Shepherd's Lead)

Members will use 4-H Online to register for the 4-H Dog Show and the 4-H Competitive Events listed below. 4-H Online entries will be accepted through July 31st at <https://v2.4honline.com/>. Some of these events have qualification requirements. Some 4-H competitive events have a small entry fee. Be sure to contact your local 4-H Office before you register for these events in 4-H Online. 4-H Online entries must be verified by the county/city 4-H Extension Office.

- Some Division X events (State 4-H Fashion Revue, 4-H Presents!, 4-H Top Chef!, and 4-H Horticultural Communications Contest)

Topics will update you on new rule and procedural changes for animals, public health, 4-H rules, fair policies, and other helpful tips to make sure you have a positive fair experience.

ALL PET SHOW EXHIBITORS: The 4-H'er and a parent or guardian must attend one of the quality assurance meetings held in the Heritage building at 8:30 a.m. sharp on one of the workdays.

Please check the fair catalog for all requirements of pets entered in the pet show. All required identification and testing requirements/certificates for all species will be enforced the same as any other livestock event at the fair. This could be tattoos, RFD tags, etc.

Dogs and Cats MUST have a current rabies certificate at check in. Rabies tags will NOT be accepted as proof of current vaccine.

Please read the rules carefully for everything, including promotion. Pets shown in the pet show cannot be shown in any other fair event.

## **Rabbit Exhibitors**

As per Maryland Department of Agriculture, all rabbits must be tattooed in the left ear for positive identification. This is a rule that must be enforced as animals in the pet show are subject to inspection and held to the same standards as all other livestock. The Montgomery County Rabbit Club has generously offered free tattoo(s) for any rabbit(s) entered in the pet show on the last workday, August 6 in the morning. Please look for the Fair Veterinarian if your rabbit needs a tattoo.

The Pet Show is about having lots of FUN! Please join us.

## **Share at the Fair**

Exhibiting your projects is one requirement for completing 4-H projects, and the fair is a great place to do just that! If you are enrolled in Montgomery County 4-H, the Adventure in Science program, or a 4-H afterschool program you are eligible to enter your exhibits in the 4-H Building or in any of the 4-H outdoor activities.

## **Parade Floats**

The 2024 4-H Parade Theme for the Montgomery County Agricultural fair is "Marching through time".

The 4-H Parade theme complements this year's Agricultural Fair theme of "Yesterday, Today, and Tomorrow".

For comprehensive parade rules, please check the printed and online catalog when available. In the meantime, please use the following guidelines for brainstorming and constructing your float.

Each float or special unit must send a float entry form and narrative script to the 4-H Office by July 15. The narrative should not exceed 40 words. The float should not need to be explained by a script.

## Entering Your Work At The Fair

4-H Indoor and demonstration entry registrations must be entered online by July 20. Each exhibit must have a pre-printed tag firmly attached to it on entry night.

An exhibitor may enter only one exhibit per class.

Exhibitors are responsible for verifying the accuracy of their entries. If you have a problem or correction, you **MUST** contact the Fair Office in person or by phone at 301-926-3100. It is highly recommended that all exhibitors bring their On-Line Entry Receipt with them to entry night.

Entries can be found at the top left corner of the Montgomery County Fair website or at <https://montco.fairwire.com/default.aspx> These entries are due by July 20th, 2024. If you have any questions or concerns, reach out to the Montgomery County Fair Team.

When entering online, please make sure you are entering in the desired department - 4-H or Open. Please print a receipt for your records.

If you are not able to enter your exhibits using the online system, paper entry forms are available in the back of the fair catalog. Please mail all paper entry forms to the Fair Office (NOT THE 4-H OFFICE): Montgomery Co. Agricultural Fair, 16 Chestnut St., Gaithersburg, MD 20877.

Once the fairground receives all 4-H entry registrations, they generate the display tags for each entry. Leaders will be notified when tags are ready to pick up.

Display tags must accompany each indoor entry at the fair. You must make an appointment to pick up your tags at the 4-H office. Alternatively, you can pick up your tags at the Fairground on entry day. If you wish to volunteer to help sort tags, contact Jeannine Shriver at [jshriver@umd.edu](mailto:jshriver@umd.edu).

## New Rule for information for Division 13 - Vegetables and Fruits, and Division -14 Flower Specimens

Although pre-entries for Fair are required by July 20th, under divisions 13 and 14 (Horticulture) pre-entry will not be a requirement but is still encouraged, before the indoor entry days. This includes all vegetables, fruits, and flower specimens. We understand that many times the weather and other environmental factors play such a vital role in these entries and their success, making it difficult to know what your entries might be a month ahead of time. We encourage you to enter your project online, but on-site entry is allowed for Divisions 13 and 14.

Blank entry tags will be provided at check-in for divisions 13 and 14. These items will be received on Saturday, August 10th, from 3-6 p.m. as usual. Remember to arrive early to give our youth enough time to fill out their tags. Poster boards will be placed with a "how-to" on filling out your tag and volunteers will be stationed at the check-in to help our youth fill these out.

## How to bring your indoor entries to the 4-H Building at the Fair

Monday, August 5 – only day to enter club booths and banners, 6:00-8:00 p.m. Club books are optional on Monday.

Wednesday, August 7 – 4-H non-perishable entry drop-off, 4:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m.  
DOORS WILL BE CLOSED AT 7:30 P.M. NO LATE DROP-OFFS WILL BE ACCEPTED!

Saturday, August 10 - Perishable entry drop-off, 3:00–6:00 p.m.

Pick up day—Sunday, August 18 from 11:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m. All exhibits unclaimed by Sunday, August 18 at 2:00 p.m. will become the property of the fair.

EXHIBITS WILL NOT BE TAKEN BACK TO THE 4-H OFFICE.

The Fair or the 4-H Office will NOT be responsible for any damage to an exhibit while at the fair.

## Booths and Banners State Guidelines

Please remember, the State Fair guidelines for entering booths and banners are different from the Montgomery County Fair.

Banners: ALL clubs may enter their banners in the State Fair. However, Clubs must enter them themselves using the online State Fair entry system.

Booths: ONLY County Fair champion “State Fair Themed Booths” can be entered at the State Fair.

If you wish to enter your banner or booth, make sure it complies with the State Fair Catalog rules.

You are responsible for getting your booth or banner to and from the State Fair.

The 2024 State Fair Booth/Banner Theme can be found under “Department T - 4-H/FAA Promotion”.

Banner dimensions: 50” wide X 38” tall. The opening for the pole should to be a minimum of 3”, and is included in the overall size of 38” long. Do not bring your own pole. You MUST use these dimensions or you will be disqualified.

## 4-H Cake Auction Sunday, August 11

The Cake Auction will take place in the Cattle Pavilion on Sunday, August 11 at 6:30 p.m. Cakes that won blue ribbons at the fair will be auctioned off to the highest bidder—this is our main fundraiser for the Montgomery County 4-H Program. All money raised from the auction goes to Montgomery County 4-H to provide programs and opportunities for our 4-H youth and volunteers. Some of the things the funds are used for include resource materials, ribbons and awards, registration fees, and scholarships.
