

# Which file type should I use?

## EPS, JPG, or PNG?

All images come in EPS, JPG, and PNG versions.

- EPS versions are vector files that can be sent to professional printers.
- JPG versions have a white background and should only be used on a white background (e.g., in Powerpoints, websites).
- PNG versions have a transparent background and are meant to be used on a screen.

Please read Page 12 of the Style Guide for more information about the difference between EPS, JPG, and PNG files and when to use which type of file.

## Full Color, Black, or Reversed (aka White)?

All logos come in full color, black, and reversed (aka white) versions.

- Use the Full Color logo only on white or cream backgrounds or items.
- Use the Black logo on lighter/non-white background or items.
- Use the Reversed (aka white) logo on darker backgrounds or items.

## Horizontal or Stacked?

All logos come in horizontal and stacked versions. Use the horizontal or stacked version depending on the space you have for the logo.

- Use the horizontal version if you have a wider space for the logo.
- Use the stacked version if the space for the logo is narrow.

## RGB or CMYK?

- FullColor\_RGB is for screen applications
- FullColor\_CMYK is for print applications

## When would I use the icons?

Please read page 10 of the style guide. The Master Gardener icon would be an excellent choice for a Facebook profile picture, especially assuming that the full program name is listed directly below the profile picture. Subset program icons may be used as a decorative element in PowerPoint slides. Whenever possible, make sure the full name of the program is also visible elsewhere on the item (e.g., on the website or presentation).

## I want to get shirts made. Which logo should I send to the printer?

### If the shirt is white or cream:

Master Gardener > Master Gardener Logo > Full Logo > EPS > UME\_MGLogo\_withUME\_STACKED\_FullColor\_CMYK.eps

### If the shirt is a dark color:

Master Gardener > Master Gardener Logo > Full Logo > EPS > UME\_MGLogo\_withUME\_STACKED\_Reversed.eps

### If the shirt is a light (non-white color):

Master Gardener > Master Gardener Logo > Full Logo > EPS > UME\_MGLogo\_withUME\_STACKED\_Black.eps

## When do I use the Master Gardener logo versus a subset program logo?

### UME + Master Gardener logo

Use this logo when there is NOT one particular subset program (e.g., Pollinators, Bay-Wise, Grow It Eat It) being clearly promoted.

### UME + Subset program logo

Use a subset program logo when you are clearly promoting one particular subset program above all others.
